

**PARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE
WEEKLY ACTIVITY REPORT
FEB. 09, 2018 THROUGH FEB. 15, 2018**

Friday, 02/09/18 Hwy 24 mile marker 250-Traffic Stop leads to DUI-D Arrest

Deputy stopped an east-bound vehicle for speeding 79 mph in a posted 65 mph zone. The Deputy detected the odor of marijuana and conducted Standard Field Sobriety Tests (SFST) which the driver failed to complete as a sober party would. Driver cited for speeding and arrested for No Insurance and DUI-D (Driving under the Influence of Drugs) and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Friday, 02/09/18 Hwy 9 mile marker 62-Defective Tail light turns into DUI Arrest

Deputy stopped a south-bound vehicle for a defective tail light. The Deputy detected the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage and conducted SFTSs. The driver failed to perform as a sober person would and was cited for Defective Vehicle and arrested for DUI and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Friday, 02/09/18 Main St., Fairplay-No Headlights for a DUI Driver

At 11:17 PM a Deputy observed a vehicle travelling north-bound on Main St. in Fairplay without their headlights on. A traffic stop was conducted and the driver emitted the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage while searching for his paperwork. The driver's license was "cancelled/denied". Voluntary SFTSs were requested and the driver failed to perform as a sober party would. The driver was arrested for DUI and cited for Driving when Headlights Required and Driving under Restraint and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Friday, 02/09/18 Park County Numerous Other Arrests on Friday Night

Other traffic stops resulted in seven other arrests for various warrants from various other Counties. The total of nine arrests was not the result of a special DUI enforcement focus, just in the course of normal patrol.

Saturday, 02/10/18 Shell Station, Fairplay-Suspicious Vehicle turns into DUI Arrest

A suspicious vehicle was seen driving around the closed Shell station early on the morning of Saturday, 02/10/18 and when contacted and the driver gave off the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage. The male driver then failed to perform the SFSTs as a sober party would. He was arrested for DUI and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Saturday, 02/10/18 Loaf and Jug, Bailey-Suspicious Vehicle Check leads to Drug Possession Arrest

Deputies contacted a suspicious vehicle early Saturday morning at the air compressor at the Loaf and Jug. The driver acted erratically when asked why he was parked by the compressor without using it. As he exited the vehicle, the under 21 year old driver dropped a baggie of marijuana which led to a search of the vehicle. Methamphetamine and paraphernalia were discovered. Driver was arrested for

Possession of a Controlled Substance, Minor in Possession (of marijuana) and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Sunday, 02/11/18 Cr 43-No Front Plate and Driver was Cancelled/Denied with no Insurance and more.

A Deputy initiated a traffic stop for a vehicle with no front plate and a cracked windshield. The driver's license privilege was cancelled/denied and he was the restrained party in a Protection Order with the passenger as the protected party. One of the conditions of the order was to not possess or consume alcohol and the deputy detected the odor of an unknown alcoholic beverage. He was arrested for Driving under Restraint, Violation of a Protection Order and Operating an Uninsured Motor Vehicle and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Sunday, 02/11/18 KZ Ranch Subdivision-Disturbance Call-Violation of a Protection Order, Criminal Mischief

At 3:38 PM on Sunday, February 11, Deputies responded to a Disturbance in Progress call in the KZ Ranch Subdivision where a male party was contacted. The investigation resulted in the arrest of the male for Criminal Mischief and Violation of a Protection order with the enhancer of Domestic Violence. The male party was transported to a hospital for medical reasons and eventually detained by the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office until he could be transported to the Park County Jail.

Thursday, 02/15/17 Sheriff's Office, Fairplay-Come to the SO for a VIN, leave with DUI-D Charge

A male party arrived at the Fairplay Sheriff's Office and requested a VIN inspection. While speaking to a Deputy his actions indicated some form of impairment. The male party volunteered to perform SFSTs and did not complete them as a sober party would. The suspected impairment may have been the result of medications and due to his health conditions, was issued a summons for DUI-D and released to a relative.

Thursday, 02/15/17 Rosalie Rd. Bailey-Speeder with no License is an Habitual Traffic Offender

At approximately 7:00 PM on Thursday, February 15, 2018 a traffic stop was conducted by a Deputy on a vehicle travelling on Hwy 285 at 61 mph in a posted 50 mph zone/ the driver eventually stopped on Rosalie Rd. and admitted to the Deputy that he didn't have a driver's license. The driver stated that he would have one, except he keeps getting pulled over and that's a setback for him. The driver's license was revoked for Habitual Traffic Offender and he had 28 active restraints against his license (previous notifications). The driver was arrested and transported to the Park County Jail.

Today's hint: don't speed on Park County roads, especially if you're under the influence and/or have warrants. It's also probably a real good idea to have a valid driver's license...
