

**PARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE
WEEKLY ACTIVITY REPORT
MARCH 23, 2018 THROUGH MARCH 29, 2018**

Saturday, 03/24/2018-Accident and Subsequent Assault/Fight

On Saturday, March 24, 2018 at around 5:30 PM deputies responded to a report of a hit-and-run accident on CR 100 near Guffey. As the two deputies were enroute it was additionally reported that the driver of the "run" vehicle had hit a power pole and then assaulted a home owner who confronted him and then left the scene. An additional report came in that the run driver had shown up at the Teller County Sheriff's Office and was making a report. One deputy went to the Guffey location and the other continued on to the Sheriff's Office in Divide. Fire and medical also responded to Cr 100 and evaluated the injured party. Both male parties indicted that the other party began the physical contact and the investigation continues.

Sunday, 03/25/2018-Domestic Violence near Hartsel

Deputies responded to an address in Ranch of the Rockies subdivision on Sunday, March 25 when they were advised of a 911 call regarding a domestic violence in-progress call to Park County Communications that came in at approximately 10:30 PM. The Deputies located a female party at the Fire Station near Hwy 25 and Ranch Rd. and took her statement. Later the Deputies accompanied the woman to the residence for her to retrieve some personal belongings and eventually located the male party as well. After hearing his version of the event and noting the various pieces of evidence that supported his narrative the female party was arrested and transported to the Park County Jail. She was charged with Assault in the Third Degree and Domestic Violence.

Monday, 03/26/2018-Argument Becomes Domestic Violence near Fairplay

At approximately 8:30 PM on Monday, March 26 a call came into Park County Communications from a female party who reported that she had left the residence after being assaulted by her male partner. No evidence of the alleged assault was observed by the responding Deputy. Upon arriving at the residence the male party and a witness provided another version of the events which was confirmed by evidence. The female party was arrested and transported to the Park County Jail where she was charged with Assault in the Third Degree and Domestic Violence.

Thursday, 03/29/2018-Driving under the Influence of Drugs Arrest-Bailey

Around 5:30 PM on Thursday, March 29 a deputy on routine patrol observed a northbound Toyota Tundra at an estimated 75 mph in a posted 50 mph zone on Crow Hill. She activated her radar and confirmed speed of 76 mph. A traffic stop was conducted on Bulldogger Rd. and the deputy became aware of the odor of marijuana when the driver was contacted. The driver was suspended for excessive points with two additional active restraints on his driving privilege and gave indications of impairment. The deputy requested voluntary SFSTs which the driver agreed to perform, but did not perform in the manner a sober party would. He was arrested, transported to the Park County Jail and charged with Drove Vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs or both; Drove Motor Vehicle when License Under Restraint (Suspended); Speeding 78MPH in a 50MPH Zone; Careless Driving and Possessed Open Marijuana Container in Motor Vehicle. Additionally a Proof of Service was issued for the suspended driver's license.

The week of 03/25/2018-03/29/2018-Tourist Season Has Begun

During the week of Sunday, March 25 through Thursday, March 29 Deputies responded to an early morning Motorist Assist call on CR 18 for a party stuck in the snow and again on a different day to CR 18 for hikers who needed assistance returning to their vehicle.

Search and Rescue was called out to rescue parties who went four-wheeling behind Alma and became stuck in the snow.

On Thursday 03/29/2018 at approximately 5:30 PM a male party decided to stop in the driveway of a Sheriff's Office Captain to relieve himself. The Captain responded in his unmarked patrol vehicle and because of the conversation that ensued, learning occurred for the young man.
