

**PARK COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE  
WEEKLY ACTIVITY REPORT  
MARCH 30, 2018 THROUGH APRIL 05, 2018**

**Friday, 03/30/2018-Vehicular Assault/Domestic Violence/Child Abuse near Hartsel**

Numerous calls into Park County Communications had Deputies responding to the Hartsel area for reports of two vehicles "ramming each other" on Friday, March 30<sup>th</sup> around 8:39 PM. One abandoned vehicle was located on Hwy 9 and the other vehicle was found on CR 439 where the female victim and her children were also found. Investigation revealed that a verbal argument had escalated and the female attempted to leave with the children and the male party tried to stop them by ramming their vehicle. The intoxicated male was arrested and charged with: *Attempted Vehicular Assault; Vehicular Assault; Felony Menacing; Child Abuse; Reckless Endangerment; Harassment; 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree Assault; Criminal Mischief; Domestic Violence; Following too closely; Failed to Notify Police of a Crash and Reckless Driving.* The male party was transported to the Park County Jail.

**Saturday, 03/31/2018-FBI Spying from Neighbor's Basement/Threats near Hartsel**

A male party from the Hartsel area called to report a voicemail from a neighbor who threatened to damage the reporting party's property unless the FBI left him alone. The neighbor alleged that the FBI is in the RP's basement spying on him to "commit absence of malice against me for exposing my x wife XXXXX/XXXXX/XXXX as a confidential informant in 1996." A report was taken and no crime was committed.

**Saturday, 03/31/2018-Summons Issued for Assault 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree, Guffey**

Following an investigation into the accident/assault call from the previous week near Guffey, Deputies returned to the area and gave a summons for *Assault 3<sup>rd</sup> Degree* to the original reporting party as he apparently began the confrontation that led to his injuries in the resulting scuffle.

**Sunday, 04/01/2018-No Number Plates on Vehicle Traffic Stop Leads to Arrest in Bailey**

On Sunday morning at approximately 09:30 AM a Deputy on CR 43 noticed a Ford Ranger pass with no visible license plates. When the Deputy attempted to initiate a traffic stop the vehicle the driver sped up and attempted to elude the Sheriff's vehicle. The driver pulled into the parking lot of Camp Ida-Ra-Ha-Je where he was contacted. The driver stated that he didn't have a driver's license, didn't have insurance and "never bothered" to get plates on the vehicle after he bought it in December, 2017. He also told the Deputy that since he was on private property the Deputy did not have authority to contact him. He was in error regarding this and was arrested and charged with: *Owner Operated Uninsured Motor Vehicle; Drove Motor Vehicle when License Under Restraint (with three additional active restraints) and Registration Required.* He was transported to the Park County Jail.

**Monday, 04/02/2018-DUI Arrest, Ranch of the Rockies Subdivision**

On Monday, April 02, 2018 at around 4:30 PM Deputies were called to the Ranch of the Rockies area to look for a "suspicious" male party who was jumping fences and knocking on doors. A Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife Office had contacted the individual and learned that he was looking for a missing dog. A Deputy remained in the area until around 6:00 PM but was Unable to Locate (UTL) the party or the Jaguar vehicle the CDPW Officer had told him about. At

around 7:15 PM the original reporting party called again and the responding Deputy found the Jaguar in a ditch, running with the car transmission in reverse and with the driver either unconscious or asleep lying against the console. Numerous empty beer cans were also noticed in the vehicle. When the Deputy was finally able to awaken the driver he asked him what had happened and the driver stated: "You tell me." When the Deputy asked for identification, his name and if he had anything to drink that day the driver responded "No" to all questions. The Deputy then asked him if he would like to perform voluntary SFSTs and the driver responded: "No, because we both know I'm going to fail them." After being taken into custody the driver's ID was located and when run through Communications came back with a warrant from Jefferson County for *Failure to Appear (FTA)* for a previous DUI and his driving privilege was revoked for three previous DUI convictions. He was transported to the Park County Jail and charged with: *Driving Under the Influence of Alcohol (Class 4 Felony); Open Alcoholic Beverage Container; Careless Driving and Driving Under Restraint (Revoked)*. Colorado State Patrol took the report on the accident.

**Wednesday, 04/04/2018 Re-arrest for Out-of-State Warrant** At approximately 09:40 AM on Wednesday, April 04 an inmate was released for "time served" on a Park County sentence, and was then booked in on a warrant out of California with a bond of \$15,000. He was then transported to the Park County Combined Court where he signed the Waiver of Extradition and now is awaiting transport to Orange County, California to answer those charges.
