APRIL 20, 2018 THROUGH APRIL 26, 2018**

**Speeder arrested for Habitual Traffic Offender**

At approximately 10:40 Am on Friday, April 20, 2018 a Deputy's RADAR recorded a vehicle at 73 mph in a posted 50 mph zone at mile marker 225 on Hwy. 285 near Bailey. When stopped the driver admitted that he didn't have a driver's license and Park County Communications confirmed this with the additional information that the male party was revoked for HTO with eleven additional restraints against his driving privilege. He was arrested and transported to the Park County Jail.

**Structure Fire near Hartsel Suspected of being Arson**

A report was made to Park County Communications late morning on Friday, April 20, 2018 of a possible structure fire visible from Highway 24 east of Hartsel. A Deputy responded and as the Firefighters attempted to contain the fire contacted witnesses and surveyed the remaining structure at the scene. An empty five-gallon gas can (later identified by the property owner) was located and the gate to the property was apparently forced open. Witness photographs of the rapidly expanding fire showed an open front door and broken windows. Additionally, an ATV had been moved from the garage and an attempt had been made to disguise its appearance. The investigation continues.

**Driver Found Passed Out Behind the Wheel with Suspended Driver's License**

Early Saturday morning, April 21, 2018 Park County Communications received a report of a male party who appeared to be either asleep or passed out behind the wheel of his vehicle near the intersection of Bluebird and Mockingbird near Bailey. Deputies contacted the party and he was found to have a suspended driver's license with three additional active restraints against his driving privileges. He was taken into custody. During the inventory search necessary for the tow report drug paraphernalia was located in plain view. The party was charged with *Drove Motor/Off Highway Vehicle when license Under Restraint (Suspended); Possession of Drug Paraphernalia* and he was transported to the Park County Jail. The vehicle was impounded and towed to the Park County Sheriff's Office to be processed once a search warrant could be reviewed and approved by a judge.

**Probation Client Drove to the Sheriff's Office for a Breath Test while her License was Revoked**

A female party was observed on camera as she exited the driver's side of her vehicle in the Sheriff's Office parking lot when she came for her mandatory breath test on Monday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> at approximately 8:00 PM. Detention Deputies checked her for warrants and found that her driving privilege was *Revoked: Per Se 0.08*. A Patrol Deputy was made aware of this and he attempted to contact her in the parking lot, but she drove away. The Deputy caught up with her at CR 16 and Hwy. 285. She was arrested and transported back to the Park County Jail and charged with *Driving under Revocation-Alcohol Related*.

**Parent Who Failed to Pick up Child from the Bus Stop was Arrested at School for DUI/DUID**

At approximately 5:55 PM on Thursday, April 26 a Deputy and a representative of the Department of Human Services responded to Deer Creek Elementary School after the school bus returned a child to the school whose parent had not met the bus at the school bus stop. The parent later arrived at the school and claimed to have fallen asleep as the reason for missing the bus. The odor of an unknown alcoholic

beverage was noted and the parent admitted to using marijuana and drinking “a beer”. The female party that accompanied the parent was interviewed by a Colorado State Patrol Trooper and stated that the male parent had driven both to the school. The male party agreed to perform SFSTs and when he did so he did not perform them in the manner of a sober party. He was subsequently arrested and transported to the Park County Jail and charged with *Drove Vehicle while Under the Influence of Alcohol or Drugs or Both* and *Drove Vehicle with Blood Alcohol Content of 0.08 or More*. The juvenile child was released to the male party’s attorney, who was present.

### **Dispute at National Forest Campsite ends in Arrest**

A male party called Park County Communications at 6:17 PM on Thursday, April 26 to report that a second male party was threatening to “blow his f-----g head off” and accusing the reporting party of “living” in the forest. Deputies responded and interviewed both parties. The RP had retrieved his handgun and displayed it, still holstered as he was in fear for his life based on the aggressive party’s statement, then he locked himself in his camper until Law Enforcement arrived on scene. When interviewing the more second party the Deputy detected the presence of alcohol and voluntary roadside maneuvers were attempted, but not performed in the manner of a sober party, so he was taken into custody. After a blood draw he was transported to the Park County Jail and charged with *DUI/DUID; Harassment* and *Menacing*.
