WEEKLY ACTIVITY REPORT
MAY 18, 2018 THROUGH MAY 24, 2018**

Stolen Vehicle Reported, then Recovered, Bailey

On May 18, 2018 at 9:51 AM a male party in Pine reported his Toyota Camry was stolen from his residence during the previous night. At around 3:00 PM on May 18 a Jefferson County Deputy reported locating an abandoned vehicle in a ditch just inside the JeffCo line that came back to the reported stolen vehicle. A ParkCo deputy responded, collected evidence and the vehicle was returned to its rightful owner.

Assault in Progress, Fairplay

Two deputies responded to a business in Fairplay just after midnight on the morning Monday, May 21 and found an adult male and two juvenile males in an argument with a second adult male in a vehicle on Main St. Deputies separated the parties and observed injuries on both adults. Deputies learned that one adult party believed that the other adult was having some type of argument with the two juveniles and a struggle ensued. During the course of the scuffle the younger male party allegedly picked up a kitchen knife and held it to the throat of the other male. The younger male party was arrested and charged with *Assault in the Second Degree* and *Felony Menacing*.

Dispute over Ice Machine, Grant

On Tuesday, May 22, 2018, at approximately 10:45 AM Deputies received a radio dispatched call of an in-progress disturbance involving a man with a gun at a business in Grant. Park County Communications further reported that the man with a gun left the scene and returned with a "bobcat" and was stealing an ice machine that was located on the property. The party who took the ice machine, the antiques sign attached and the ice inside was arrested and charged with *Second Degree Criminal Trespass, Menacing, Theft* and *Disorderly Conduct* and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Hit and Run Accident, Loaf and Jug, Bailey

Tuesday May 22, 2018 at about 9:32 PM a Deputy was dispatched to a two-car accident on private property at the Loaf/Jug Gas Station near Bailey. Upon my arrival the Deputy was told of a vehicle which had backed into another car (parked/unattended) and had left the scene. The Deputy was able to identify the driver of the suspect vehicle. The driver was interviewed and he admitted to being the driver. He did not see the vehicle he collided with until it after the collision. The vehicle he was driving had an expired license plate. The driver did not remain at the scene of the accident after being told 911 had been called by the operator of the other vehicle. The damage to the second vehicle was estimated over \$1,000. The driver also did not call 911 after causing the accident. The driver was arrested on two outstanding warrants and was charged with *Displayed Expired Plates; Failed to Report Property Damage Accident; Failed to Give Notice/Aid – Unattended Vehicle; Failed to Report Accident* and *Improper Backing* and was transported to the Park County Jail.

Suspicious Vehicle Call leads to Warrant Arrest

On Wednesday May 23, 2018 at approximately 1200 PM Park County Communications (PCC) aired a possible suspicious vehicle on or near Duck Creek Rd. near the town of Grant. Deputies responded and

located the vehicle. The driver was contacted and provided his identification. When his name was run through Park County Communication he was found to have a felony warrant out of Jefferson County. In addition his Colorado Driver's License was revoked and did not have vehicle registration or proof of insurance in the vehicle. The driver was arrested for the warrant and charged locally with *Drove Motor Vehicle when License under Restraint: Revoked* and *Operated Uninsured Motor vehicle on a Public Roadway*.

Neighbor Dispute, Ranch of the Rockies

Deputies were dispatched to a reported neighbor dispute in the Ranch of the Rockies subdivision, near Hartsel on Thursday, May 24 at approximately 7:30 AM. Deputies learned that one neighbor was told to leave his neighbor's property and when he wouldn't the property owner allegedly shoved the older male party who went to the ground. The property owner then continued to strike the neighbor. Both were served summons. The property owner was charged with *Assault in the Third Degree* and *Crimes against at Risk Adults*. The neighbor was charged with *Third Degree Trespassing*.

Dispute, Friendship Ranch leads to Domestic Violence Arrest

On Thursday at approximately 9:15 PM Deputies were dispatched to an address in Friendship Ranch, near Bailey for a dispute between a male and female party. The reporting party stated that his neighbor was fighting with her husband and he said she got spit on the face by her husband. He also stated the husband left a few minutes before we arrived on scene but before he left the husband yelled that everyone was going to die and he was going to kill everyone. Jason explained to me the husband has also said he was going to burn his own house down. After further investigation the male party was arrested and charged with Menacing, Harassment, Child Abuse without Injury and Domestic Violence. He was transported to the Park County Jail.
